Dear Gray:

I talked with Mrs. Hill about the deed to the North Rose Fire Company while I was in North Rose last Saturday. We tried to contact you but were unable to do so.

I wish you would talk with her and come to some kind of understanding concerning an entrance to the park that she wants erected, what the park shall be called and what shall happen to it as, if and when the fire company has no further use for it.

I have tried to go over these matters with her and have made some suggestions but believe that a representative of the fire company should talk with her before I prepare the deed. The only suggestions that I made were concerning the material to be used in the erection of the entrance, but I do not believe she has any intention of placing any restriction on the material to be used. My only thought on the matter was that a cobble-stone post would make a better appearance for a park for the reason that it is more rustic and looks better if grass is allowed to grow up around it then would a brick or wood post. I would also suggest that at the time the post is erected, that the same be wired so that an electric light could be placed on top of the same if it was ever desired.

These are merely suggestions and I would like to have you talk the matter over with Mrs. Hill so that when it is finally settled, I can complete the job I have undertaken.
